

Privacy Notice

Mission Sports, Inc.(the company) & ATP36 (the program and website) understand that you care how information about you is used and shared. This notice describes our privacy policy. **By visiting Mission Sports & ATP36 website, you are accepting the practices described in this Privacy Notice.**

What personal information does Mission Sports gather? Here are the types of information we gather.

Information you give us: We receive and store any information you enter on our website or give us in any other way. We use the information that you provide for such purposes as responding to your requests, improving our services, and communicating with you. *Examples of Information We Collect* : You provide information when you search, post, participate in a survey, register, or communicate with our help desk. As a result of those actions, you might supply us with such information as your credit card information; e-mail addresses; content of e-mails to us; and financial information.

Automatic information: We receive and store certain types of information whenever you interact with us. For example, like many websites, we use "cookies," and we obtain certain types of information when your Web browser accesses Mission Sports. Examples of the information we collect and analyze include the Internet protocol (IP) address used to connect your computer to the Internet; login; e-mail address; password (when applicable); computer and connection information such as browser type and version; the full Uniform Resource Locator (URL) click stream to, through, and from our website, including date and time; cookie number; and courses you viewed or searched for. During some visits we may use software tools such as JavaScript to measure and collect session information, including page response times, download errors, length of visits to certain pages, page interaction

information (such as scrolling, clicks, and mouse-overs), and methods used to browse away from the page.

E-mail communications: To help us make e-mails more useful and interesting, we often receive a confirmation when you open e-mail from Mission Sports, if your computer supports such capabilities. If you do not want to receive e-mails from us, please adjust your Email Preferences on your system user profile.

What about cookies?

Cookies are alphanumeric identifiers that we transfer to your computer's hard drive through your Web browser to enable our systems to recognize your browser and help to personalize your online experience.

Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer. Cookies are uniquely assigned to your computer and can only be read by a web service in the domain that issued the cookie to you.

We recommend that you leave them turned on, however, the Help portion of the toolbar on most browsers will tell you how to prevent your browser from accepting new cookies, how to have the browser notify you when you receive a new cookie, or how to disable cookies.

How secure is information about me?

Mission Sports does not share your information with third parties. We are committed to protecting the security of your personal information. We use a variety of security technologies and procedures to help protect your personal information from unauthorized access, use, or disclosure. For example, we store the personal information is stored and provides limited access to specific departments. In addition, your credit card/e-check account numbers are encrypted through Paypal. Paypal works to protect the security of your information during transmission by using Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) software, which encrypts information you input.

They reveal only the last four digits of your credit card numbers when confirming a transaction. It is important for you to protect against unauthorized access to your password and to your computer. Be sure to sign off when finished using a shared computer.

State Rules: Please note that Florida's public records law requires that all information received in connection with State business be made available to anyone upon request, unless the information is subject to a specific statutory exemption. Credit card, electronic payment, password, and other personal data are examples of information that is excluded from public record disclosure.

What choices do I have?

If you do not want to receive e-mail from us, please adjust your Email Preferences on your system user profile.

You have the ability to accept or decline cookies. Most Web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer. If you choose to decline cookies, you may not be able to fully experience the interactive features of our website(s).

If you are using a public terminal, you will want to log off, or sign out, before you leave the terminal. For extra security, close your browser after your log off.
